What is the Purpose of the Grants Programme 2025?

The purpose is to support organisations aiming to prevent or intervene in the consequences of poverty on young children and their families, and to enhance the wellbeing of their families and communities.

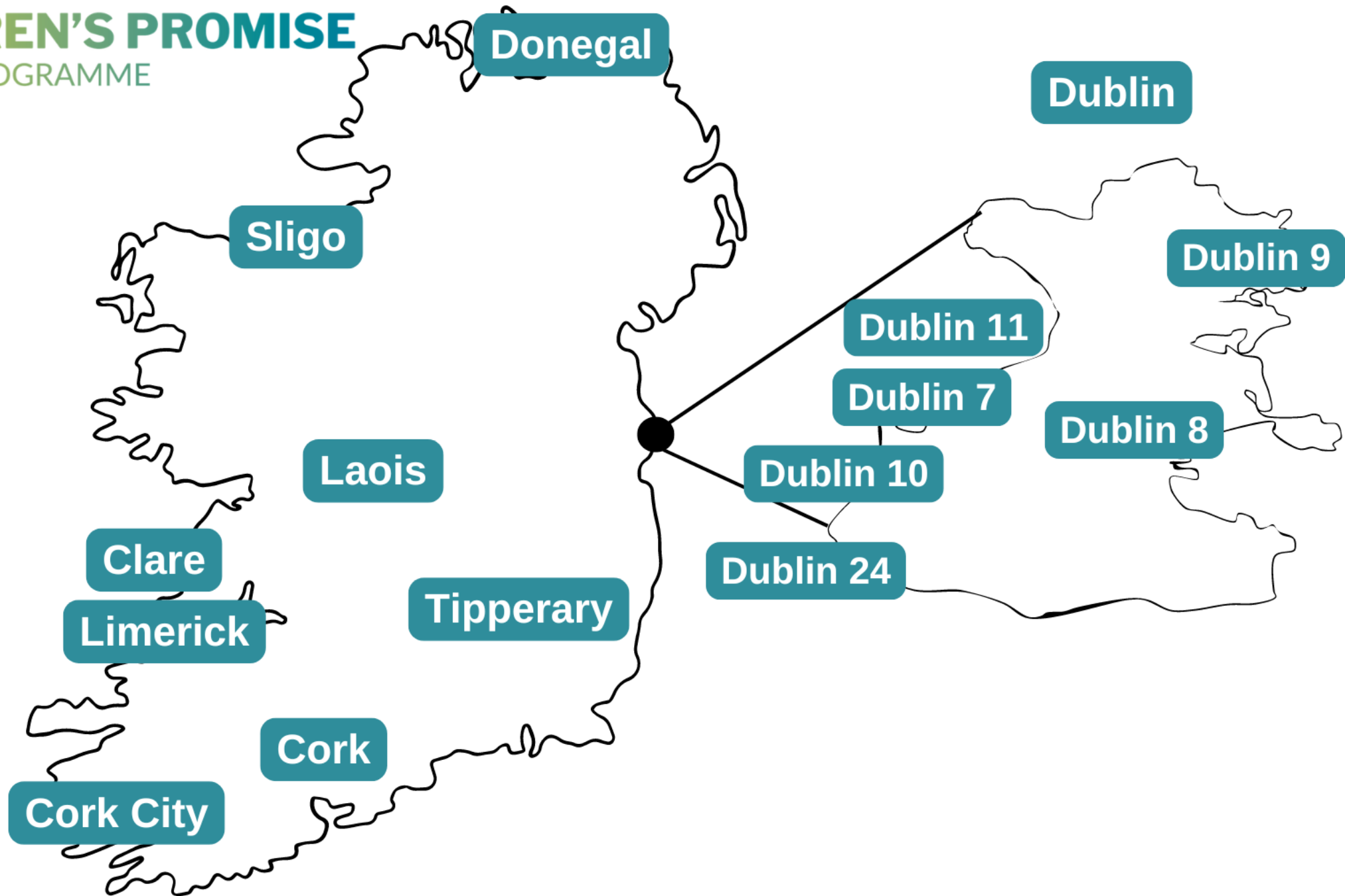

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WHO IS IT AIMED AT?



Community-based organisations, supporting young children and their families who are living in disadvantaged circumstances.

WHAT DOES IT OFFER?



One to three year financial and other supports to selected organisations.

WHO CAN APPLY?



Small organisations that are a registered charity, or collaborations between small organisations with the lead partner as a registered charity.





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Eligible organisations will:

1



Be a child or family-focused, community-based organisation working at local level.

2



Be a registered charity – or apply in collaboration with a 'Lead partner' that is a registered charity. Or be a (non-profit) Company Limited by Guarantee.

3



Have an annual income of less than €2,000,000.

4



Have up to date and sufficient governing documents, annual accounts and child safeguarding policies.



Eligible projects/programmes will:

Support

- Support young children ages 0-5 and may include children up to 12 years of age, their parents (or guardians) and be from socio-economically disadvantaged backgrounds.

Address

- Address essential needs, creativity and play education, or improved health and wellbeing for young children and their parents.

Be

- Be a new project or a promising current project that requires additional funding.

Use

- Use the funding for project costs such as staffing, planning, events, courses or for operational costs such as day-to-day running costs (which may have increased).



How can I apply?



FIRST: Read the application guidelines in full. They are available on the KHF website.



Print out the application form questions, so that you can prepare them before you begin your Submit.com application.



SECOND: Begin your application on the Submit.com portal. Make sure to save any progress and consider downloading your responses, so you have them to hand. This process will take about 90 minutes to complete. Make sure you submit the completed application before the deadline of 20 March.



THIRD: All applications will be reviewed and projects will be notified of outcomes in early June. NOTE: All communications will be made via Submit portal throughout the process.
